### February Special Worship Service

#### Christmas, Epiphany, LENT - ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE 6 pm, February 13

It seems like we just had a Christmas Eve service, and the Baptism of the Lord service but here we are almost to the season of Lent. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. The date

of Ash Wednesday changes because the date of Easter changes each year. Ash Wednesday falls 40 days before Easter (excluding Sundays). This year Ash Wednesday is February 13.

Lent is a time of preparation when Christians observe a period of repentance, moderation, and fasting as a part of their spiritual disciple. Individuals choose how they will observe this season. Some people take some kind of pleasure away such as resisting the temptation of eating chocolate, drinking soft drinks, playing video games or some other pleasure. Often people replace that time with another activity such as additional Bible readings, writing notes of encouragement, participating in mission projects or other activity.

How will you spend your Lenten season? For starters, you can worship at St. Mark's at 6pm on Ash Wednesday. There will be a service of reflection, contemplation, scripture and music. This will include the imposition of ashes on the forehead of the worshipers. You will have the opportunity to reflect on Jesus' life and also your own.

Come and be blessed by the power of the Holy Spirit in this time of meditation, reflection and spiritual renewal.
