

BEACGON Shining Christ's light into the community

"...where they were sitting." (Acts 2:2)

The church of Jesus Christ needs "movers and shakers". The world is changing at a fast pace. We are a "mobile" world...some people are even shaving, eating, and reading while driving! I'm guilty, how about you? According to one webpage, mobile devices are now

reaching the farthest corners of the world. It was projected back in the 2011, that about 5 billion mobile phones would be in service in a world with 7 billion people.

That has multiple implications: for politics, for education, for economies, for civil society, for news and information. I would add, even for the church. Many believe "mobile" devices are "changing the world". Mobile media devices are at the hub of the global information society.

Maybe so, but I would say that the Triune God has been moving before the world even thought about becoming "mobile" and through His church, Jesus is "changing the world". The God of the bible is mobile. Genesis 1:1 tells us that the Spirit of God was "hovering" over the face of the waters at creation. Jesus tells us in Revelation 22:20, "Surely I am coming soon." In Exodus, the Israelites kept up with the pillar of cloud by day and fire by night. He was always ahead of them, leading them to the Promise Land. He led David besides still waters and in paths of righteousness in Psalm 23. Jesus descended at Christmas. Moved towards the Cross and out of the Tomb. He then ascended 40 days after Easter to be at the right hand of His glorious Father. 50 days after His ascension, the Holy Spirit descended. The Triune God of the Bible seems to be "mobile"...even at Saint Mark's. He is moving in and through His local body in Brandon, MS!

So, what does that mean for us? How do we keep up with the world, or even, God? I want to propose that we don't speed up or move more. I propose we move less and sit more.

Acts 2:1-2 is my biblical reason for saying that: "When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from Heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were <u>sitting</u>."

Sitting doing what? Praying their heart and soul out to God the Father, for 10 days straight until the Holy Spirit descended! Acts 1:14: "... devoting themselves to prayer..." Sure, we can be "mobile" prayer people...praying "on the go". Yes, we need to move and get things done. But what if we sat down, prayed the Scriptures for at least 10 minutes a day for 10 days straight sometime in May. I'd like to see God move through a united church who sits and prays. The church in Acts, with the power of the Holy Spirit, moved through Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and eventually to the ends of the earth with the Gospel of Jesus.

But it all started because they sat praying.

Her name was Susanna. She was the mother of John and Charles Wesley. Maybe you have heard of them but you may not be as familiar with her. She gave birth to 19 children, nine died as infants. She suffered many difficulties during her life not the least of which was a husband who was less than



stable as a provider for the family and actually abandoned her and the children for a year. Twice her house burned down and her children were sent to live with nearby families. And yet in her journey, Susanna's faith in God made an impact on two of her youngest children, John and Charles. Her devotion to God and her practice of faith influenced her sons in their formative years which led to them hearing God's call and began a spiritual renewal in England that marked Christian history ever since. We Methodist owe admiration to Susanna Wesley.

Mothers are to be honored the second Sunday in May. I do not know how you plan to honor and/or remember your mother. Some of you may not have received the spiritual influence from your mother like John and Charles did. In spite of that, the Scripture calls for us to honor them. Fredrick Buechner in his book, Whistling in the Dark, offers this word: "Our mothers, like our fathers, are to be honored as the Good Book says. But if Jesus is to be our guide then honoring them doesn't mean either idealizing them or idolizing them. It means both seeing them as they are and what they are not. It means the best way to repay them is to love God and our neighbor as faithfully and selflessly as at their best they have tried to love us. It means that we are to take care their needs until the end of their journey".

Mother's Day stirs up emotions in us. Some of them are joyful, others not so much. We didn't get to choose them but we can chose to love them as they were and are. I hope you will continue to find the grace to forgive them for their shortcomings and failures as well as affirm them and give thanks for the gifts you have received from their efforts.

I urge you to think of a way to honor and remember your mother this month even if she has gone to be with the Lord. Your witness to her honors God. I am grateful for Phyllis. She has encouraged me from the time I was a little boy. She told me often how proud she was of me. She disciplined me with consistency and spoke the truth when it mattered most. She still does that today. I have watched Currie do the same with our sons. Those gifts bear fruit. The conflict and the heartache that it entails at times bears witness to the source of love: God in Christ.

Join us this week in worship in the mother church, the Bride of Christ.


