An Encouraging Word From Jo Hebert

Are you like me, and you can't believe it's already February? When I try, I can still remember the stillness of Christmas and the warm celebration... a purposed focus on Christ and His birth, and the much-needed renewal. Then January came quickly. The Christmas lights came down, the kids said goodbye to sleeping until 11, and the poinsettia, once brilliant, started to decline.

Many of us began the New Year with a fresh determination and hopefulness that is now beginning to wane like my poinsettia. If that is you, I have a little story for you about a mountain and flies.

My kids are absolutely wonderful, and I don't want you thinking anything different, but *sometimes*, we have to pretty much **make** them do things we think are best, especially when there is fear involved...we don't want them to be held back by it. So, even though we were on a peaceful, fantastic vacation in Yellowstone last year when this story took place, my husband and I naturally took on the unified role of bad copbad cop as we forced our children to climb a mountain.

Mount Washburn, elevation 10,243 feet, provides a truly spectacular view. After already enjoying some big hikes, we drove most of the way up and prepared to walk the trail to the top on a beautiful, glorious day. It didn't start out bad. But, a mile into it, we realized 3 things: it was a much longer hike than we expected (6 mi), we should have brought water, and THE HORSEFLIES WERE ENORMOUS. (It must have been the elevation...but, no other hike had horseflies like these.) The kids wanted to turn back. Michael and I knew the view would be incredible, and we saw the opportunity for the kids to push through something; so, without words, he and I committed. We were not turning back.

There is no doubt my wonderful kids hated us that day. Though I tried fervently to teach a life lesson (albeit not always kindly and calmly) about pushing through obstacles...press on toward the prize...never give up...it was lost on them that day. They hated us. At one point we turned a corner and saw these gorgeous pronghorn antelope playing in the snow not far from us. It was so incredible that my oldest stopped complaining long enough to take pictures. But, once at the top, they didn't even pause to appreciate the view. They were unified too...in getting back down as fast as possible.

I hope that experience will produce fruit one day. We've had numerous opportunities since to remind them about "shooing the flies away," but it's still too soon. It just rekindles the loathing of it.

But, how about you? What's your *view*? Are you growing weary in the pursuit of it? Has your focus shifted to the flies in the way, and the pain of their bites? Are you thirsty with not enough water? It may be that, on the way to the top, times of refreshing are coming—an unexpected glimpse of something that will inspire you to the next step—if you do not turn back. But, if you turn back, you will never know.

In 2 Samuel, it says "I have pursued my enemies and destroyed them; and I have destroyed them and wounded them, so that they could not rise; they have fallen under my feet, for You have armed me with strength for the battle."

Keep swatting those flies while you take in the beauty of the Lord. He is with you. My office is just off the robe room in the main church building. Saint Mark's, there is absolutely nothing greater we can do for humanity in 2014 than to seek the Lord God by prayer.

Prayer is the single greatest thing we can do this year because prayer presses us into deep reliance on the God of the Bible.

I believe the God of Jesus Christ is having us lean into Him like never before in 2014.

Personally, you will face things this year and the difference of you making it through will be your testimony of two words, "*I prayed*". (Daniel 9:4)

I believe the difference between and "*good*" year and a "*GOD*" year for Saint Mark's will be this testimony at the end of the year: "*WE PRAYED*."

Daniel said in 9:4, "*I prayed*". But he did not just pray to any God. The verse says, "*I prayed to the Lord my God.*" When Daniel prayed to the Lord his God, *the greatest prophecy* in the entire bible concerning Jesus Christ was revealed to him (Daniel 9:24-27)!

What great thing might God reveal to you and me through prayer this year? Could it be the greatest year in Saint Mark's history because we seek the Lord's face more seriously than we have in our previous 40 years? In short, we will be tempted to explain God away.

I'm not going there. I personally invite you to not explain God away this year. Let's live a year that can only be explained by Jesus. Let's live a year of such believing prayer that when 2014 comes to a close, the only way to explain what happened in the ministries we have been given to steward will be Jesus. Who is Jesus? He is the God revealed in Daniel 9 when seen fully on the Cross: great and awesome, the One who keeps covenant; the One who is loyal and steadfast in love. He is the God in whom righteousness belongs. He is just in His wrath; forgiving in His mercy. He is the God of truth and the God who listens.

"O Lord, hear; O Lord, forgive. O Lord, pay attention and act. Delay not, for your own sake, O my God, because your city and your people are called by Your name." (Daniel 9:19)


